



Morning Keynote Speaker/Presenter: Dr. Carol Salva

Dr. Carol Salva is an award-winning educator with proven success working with unschooled / under-schooled, multilingual learners classified as SLIFE (**Students with Limited or Interrupted Formal Education**). She is a Seidlitz Education consultant and a former elementary, middle, and high school teacher. Dr. Salva is a co-author of **Boosting Achievement: Reaching Students with Interrupted Our Minimal Education** and DIYPD: A Guide to Self-Directed Learning for Educators of Multilingual Learners. She holds a doctorate in Ethical Leadership and a Master's degree in Educational Administration. Carol lives with her husband and three children in Texas.

KEYNOTE

Title: Supporting Newcomers and SLIFE - CLDE Standard: 5.09 (1)

Colorado is likely to continue to see a rise in newcomers and students with interrupted education. War, civil unrest, and other factors have led to the highest levels of displacement on record with over 80 million people forcibly displaced worldwide (UNHCR, 2021). Forty percent of these displaced people are children. These learners often arrive new to the English language and some with very little experience in formal schooling. The situation may sound overwhelming, but it is not new to our field. This talk will focus on research-based, practical moves that can greatly impact the success of SLIFE (Students with Limited or Interrupted Formal Education). Dr. Carol Salva will share examples of how educators and program leaders can best support these learners while boosting the achievement of the entire class.


TITLE: Strategies that Support Newcomers and Boost Achievement for ALL - CLDE Standard: 5.10(1)

Participants will explore engaging learning strategies which maximize English language development as students learn academic content. The session will be interactive to demonstrate effective, research-based classroom techniques that educators can implement right away. Participants will reflect on how these strategies support the belief that with support and targeted strategies, students are able to accelerate their learning despite challenges they may have faced.

Invited Feature Speaker/Presenter: Lulu Buck

Lulu Buck has been a public educator for twenty-three years and is currently the Coordinator of Educational Equity and Family Engagement for St Vrain Valley School District. Previously, Lulu was an English Language Development and World Language Senior Consultant for the Office of Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Education, and the Standards and Instructional Support Office at the Colorado Department of Education. She was also the CDE's Coordinator for the Colorado Seal of Biliteracy for High School Diplomas and Dual Language Education. Lulu was most passionate about her role as a state trainer for cultural responsiveness and equity for districts and schools, through which she had the honor of training thirty-eight Colorado school districts. She is the past-President of the Colorado Congress for Foreign Language Teachers. In 2009, she was awarded Teacher of the Year through the Colorado Congress for Foreign Language Teachers, and most recently "A Friend of the Profession" by SWCOLT. "Sue's Sky" is her first book. Lulu has woven together clear messages of acceptance and anti-bullying into the pages of this book. Sue's Sky teaches students about how a person's perspective may be different, but being different doesn't make it wrong. Sue's Sky uses the gentle metaphor of the sky to encourage young readers to accept others' perspectives of the world around them. She lives in Colorado with her two sons and their dogs.


Title: The Introduction of Social Justice Themes through a Children's Book - CLDE Standard: 5.09 (1)

Enjoy a portion of the book "Sue's Sky" read by the author Lulu Buck. Participants will get an overview of how the book was developed through the author's experience of doing equity work. 5 lessons have been developed to help support educators, caregivers and parents teach safe spaces, anti-bullying, acceptance, identity, community, bias, and teamwork. Participants will receive an overview and experience with each lesson. Participants will also receive all 5 lessons free of charge so that they can move forward making a difference in children's lives and making their spaces safe. Children need to be who they are with full acceptance. The book "Sue's Sky" was awarded a Gold Seal of approval for being a Family-Friendly Product and Service through the Mom's Choice Award.
